3. Purpose of the processing

The purpose of RADAR is to download data from multiple commercial or publicly available data sources. The data is used for statistical/economic analysis and research purposes, assessment of market sentiment and understanding of how the ECB and the ECB decisions are perceived by the public. The data will be retrieved and stored on AWS infrastructure before being copied to ECB infrastructure, Data Intelligence Service Centre (DISC). The data sources currently in scope are news data and electricity production datasets.

The news data has a broad coverage and may contain personal information if it was mentioned in the news articles. RADAR will not provide tools as part of its scope to analyse the data. The analysis will occur as part of other activities under control of the business areas that have access to the data that is collected by RADAR.

4. Description of the categories of data subjects
